## Transfer Admission Agreement Between Southern Vermont College and Santa Rosa Junior College

## I. Purpose

The purpose of the agreement is to effect the smooth transfer of students from Santa Rosa Junior College to Southern Vermont College. Attached are the program equivalencies for each major to which this agreement applies. This articulation also provides specific information whereby students who plan to transfer to Southern Vermont College can select courses which allow them to transfer up to 60 credits into the corresponding programs and meet as many curriculum requirements as possible.

## II. Terms and Conditions of the Agreement

- 1. Santa Rosa Junior College transfer students are guaranteed admission to Southern Vermont College baccalaureate programs, if the following conditions are met:
  - i. Students have a minimum cumulative grade point average of 2.0 and are in good academic standing at all institutions attended. A final GPA of 2.85 or better is required for students wishing to be eligible for consideration in the Nursing or Radiologic Technology programs.
    - a. The availability for the SVC Nursing and Radiologic Technology programs is on a "first-come, first-serve basis" and students are encouraged to apply early to help ensure placement.
    - b. Please see the attached course equivalencies for entry requirements into these programs.
  - ii. Students follow the application procedures outlined in the current Southern Vermont College Catalog and meet the eligibility criteria for admissions.
    - a. To be eligible for admission to Southern Vermont College, a student must provide official transcripts from all institutions attended. An official high school transcript with graduation date or GED is required if the student has not completed an Associate's degree. The student must also supply an essay, two (2) letters of recommendation, and a completed Dean's Report form (available from Admissions or the Southern Vermont College website: svc.edu).
- 2. Santa Rosa Junior College transfer students receive academic credit for up to 60 semester units of credits for all SRJC courses numbered 1-99 graded "C" or higher. Credits earned in developmental-level and remedial courses will not be accepted. The student's SVC cumulative GPA is calculated using credits earned at SVC only.

- 3. Southern Vermont College upper-level courses (at the 300 level or above) are listed in **BOLD** in the attached course equivalencies. Santa Rosa Junior College courses may satisfy course content, but will not receive credit for upper-level course requirements at SVC. Santa Rosa courses that are similar in content are listed in brackets, "[]", and the credits will transfer as electives only. The SVC requirement of the similar courses will be waived to avoid students taking a similar course more than once. However, Santa Rosa transfer students will be required to take a different upper-level course at SVC to fulfill program requirements and the prerequisite number of upper-level courses required.
- 4. Upon Southern Vermont College's offer of admission an official credit evaluation of all completed transferable credits will be done and sent to the student.
- 5. Santa Rosa Junior College transfer students who attend SVC full-time (12-18 credits) and reside on campus will receive one of Southern Vermont College's Transfer Scholarships worth \$5,000 per year. Santa Rosa transfer students who attend Southern Vermont College full-time and reside off campus will receive a Transfer Scholarship of \$2,500 per year. Students are eligible to receive these Transfer Scholarships for each year of attendance not to exceed three (3) years. Students who do not attend Southern Vermont College full-time are ineligible to receive this scholarship.
- 6. This agreement allows a Santa Rosa transfer student to receive a maximum of \$5,000 per year in the form of Southern Vermont College Scholarships. A student's total financial aid package at Southern Vermont College may exceed the \$5,000 maximum accounted for by this agreement, depending on eligibility for federal and/or other forms of financial aid. Students must file a FAFSA with the Southern Vermont College Financial Aid Office. Please refer to the Financial Aid Office for details and information.
- 7. Santa Rosa Junior College transfer students who attend Southern Vermont College full-time are eligible to receive a reimbursement for travel expenses. The total travel reimbursements provided by Southern Vermont College will be up to and not exceeding \$2,500 per year, and will be evenly dispersed to all SRJC students who attend SVC. The travel reimbursement can be received each year the student attends Southern Vermont College, and can only be obtained upon the presentation of appropriate receipts. The travel reimbursement only applies to students whose permanent residence is in California.
- 8. As per NCAA regulations, student-athletes who participate in Division III Athletics at Southern Vermont College are ineligible to receive the travel reimbursement outlined in Paragraph 7 above. If students begin participating

- in NCAA Athletics at Southern Vermont College after their initial matriculation, then they will no longer be eligible for this benefit, and the travel reimbursement will cease. Please refer to NCAA rules and regulations.
- 9. Santa Rosa Junior College transfer students are guaranteed housing, if desired. Please consult the Southern Vermont College Catalog for deadlines and availability.
- 10. Santa Rosa Junior College students will have their application fee waived.
